UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

Ordered, That the Majority Leader, after consultation with the Democratic Leader may proceed to executive session to consider the nomination of Rodney E. Slater, of Arkansas, to be Secretary of Transportation. Further, the nomination be considered under the following limitations: There be 30 minutes for debate equally divided between the Senator from Arizona (Mr. McCain) and the Senator from South Carolina (Mr. Hollings). Immediately following the expiration or yielding back of time the Senate proceed to a vote on the confirmation of the nomination. Following the conclusion of the vote, the President be immediately notified of the Senate's action and the Senate return to legislative session.
